Costus speciosus or crape ginger is possibly the best known cultivated species of the genus <u>Costus</u>. This plant is native to <u>southeast Asia</u>, especially on the <u>Greater Sunda Islands</u> in <u>Indonesia</u>. <u>Costus</u> differs from the common <u>ginger</u> by having only one row of spirally arranged leaves. The species reproduces rapidly by rhizome and seeds. It grows in my yard up to 8 feet tall with a beautiful single spiral leaf pattern. A red seed head is produced from the top in July and August and the white Crepe flowers grow from the seed head. Can take a lot of sun but prefers 50% shade/sun
