

Garden Phlox is a perennial native flowering plant. Also called Phlox paniculate, it is native from Maine to Georgia and west to Minnesota and Louisiana. Typically found in woodland clearings or moist meadows, it is uncommon in the wild, but its cultivars are perennial garden favorites.
